The Freight Handling Chamber has the following duties, among others:

- To oversee the functional performance of TETA subsector and guarantee the implementation of the Freight Handling Chamber's business plan;
- Determine the chamber skills development priorities;
- Monitor and ensure compliance with laws and regulations;
- Reviewing the performance of relevant Chamber and recommend appropriate interventions to the Board;
- Ensure chamber inputs to the Transport Sector Skills Plan (SSP);
- Give strategic direction and guidance to the relevant Chamber;
- Ensure requisite independent professional advice in the workings of the subsector in the quest for skills development and economic transformation;
- Ensure stakeholder management in the subsector and collaboration in the relevant chamber;
- Nominees or applicants must exhibit understanding of the functioning of SETAs in terms of requirements relating to corporate governance and ethics;
- Knowledge and understanding of the skills development landscape, National Skills Development Plan (NSDP) and their implications for SETA performance, PFMA and its regulatory prescripts; and
- Must have an appropriate blend of knowledge, skills and experience as well as personal attributes of objectivity, integrity and commitment.

Interested persons are invited to submit a covering letter, Constituency nomination letter, nominee acceptance letter, Curriculum Vitae, certified Id and qualifications. Women with relevant expertise are encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to candidates whose appointments will enhance social representativity and gender equity.
