Dear Stakeholders

We have noticed an alarming trend of false or fake advertisements by providers and individuals claiming to offer TETA accredited learning programmes and issuing fraudulent certificates of competence. Such practices undermine the provision of quality education and training in the sector and goes against the prescripts of the skills development legislation.

To preserve the integrity of the brand TETA and ensure consistent quality assurance across all programmes offered in the sector, the following should apply:

1. TETA accredited skills development providers are to comply with all quality standards,
2. Certificates and carry cards issued to learners must be supported by a TETA external moderation report endorsing the assessment results or TETA statement of results,
3. All certificates issued by TETA accredited skills development providers must comply with the following requirements:
 - name and logo of the accredited provider
 - physical address of accredited provider
 - accreditation number of provider
 - certificate identification or serial number
 - identification of Act and Regulation (if applicable)
 - full names and surname of learner
 - identification number of learner
 - unit standard ID, Description, NQF and credit value
 - lifting machine code (if applicable)
 - code description of equipment (if applicable)


- attachments and capacity (if applicable)
- restrictions of operation (if applicable)
- TETA registration number of assessor
- date of issue
- expiry date (if applicable) and
- at least two authorising signatures

Written authorisation to use the TETA logo on your marketing material and certificate templates must be obtained prior any materials being developed or produced. All requests for the use of the TETA logo must be submitted to Logorequest@teta.org.za
